Mahatma Gandhi ji settle down as a lawyer in South Africa where he took part in a political movement against racial discrimination. He had been deeply influenced by Christianity and the ideas of Tolstoy, Ruskin and Thoreau ,so he devised the technique off non -violence as an active method of political leadership in the country. At the same time ,he developed different views and ideas about economy. He was in favour of decentralized economy.

The first basic principle of Gandhiji's economic thought is a special emphasize on plane living which helps in cutting down your wants and being self reliant. Gandhian economics is a school of economic thought based on the spiritual and socio economic principles expanded by Indian leader, Mahatma Gandhiji. As a school of Economics the resulting model contained element of protectionism, nationalism adherence to the principles and objectives of non violence and rejection of class war in favour of social economic harmony. Gandhiji's economic ideas also aims to promote spiritual development and harmony with a rejection of materialism.

Swadeshi status symbol:--

The craze for foreign articles among the people this attitude is not a healthy one. It it will hamper the countries progress and development. We should inspire people to use Swadeshi's goods and so it evolving a self relianteconomy. The positive point among all is that it can help to reconstruction of our economy. Swadeshi would help in solving the problem of unemployment in respect of both the aspect quality and quantity.

Capitalist mode of production:-Reacting sharply to the evils of machinery Gandhi said, I will not have the enrichment of a few of the expense of the community. At present the machine is helping a small minority to live on the exploitation of the masses .He further positively asserted,"I want the concentration on wealth , not in the hands of few , but in the hands of all."For an immediate solution to rural India's massive poverty, unemployment problems and his social economic plans for achieving self sufficiency.Rural industries should be developed and nationally important. Gandhian alternatives was production by the message through self employment in village industries.

Trusteeship:---

Gandhi. It provides a means by which the wealthy people would be the trustees of trust that look after the welfare of the people in general. Gandhiji belived that the wealthy people could be persuaded to part with their wealth to help the poor . Gandhiji's words,"supposing I have come by a fair amount of wealth either by way of legacy or by means of trade and industry. I must know that all that wealth does not belong to me ,what belongs to the community and must be used for the welfare of the community. The founder member of J R D Tata was influenced by Gandhiji's idea of trusteeship. He developed his personal and professional life based on his idea.

Gandhiji's idea of self sufficiency is that villages must be self-sufficient in regard to food, clothes and other basic necessities. To be self-sufficient is not to be altogether self contained. In no circumstances would we be able to produce all the things we need. To become self sufficient products must be exchanged. Every village has to be self sustained and capable of managing its affairs even to the extent of defending itself against the whole world.
