As a result, he gave a revolutionary role to education in constitution. He added articles 29 and 30 to the constitution to include protection for minorities. Under article 29 of the constitution, a person's right to admission into educational institutions that the state manager or financially supports are guaranteed.

According to Article 30, all minorities should have the ability to construct and operate educational institutions of their choosing, independent of the basis of discrimination.

He paid high value on education because he believed that education is the test means of putting a stop of social captivity.

Teaching will help these people to gain social status, economic growth and political independence.

Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar and Philosophy:

- Dr. Ambedkar strongly said that social equality, justice and freedom were the pre-requisites for swaraj.
